# Key headlines

- Average rents in the UK continue to see a slower rate of rental growth compared to last year
- The average UK rental value was £888pcm this is 0.7% higher than the same period last year (£882pcm)
- Since July 2016, rents in Greater London have seen a slower pace of annual growth compared to last year
- The average rental value in Greater London is £1,497pcm this is 0.4% higher than the same period last year (£1,490)
- Average rental values have increased in ten out of twelve regions in the UK, compared to the same period last year
- In January 2017, the UK household rent to income ratio was 28.4%



# January 2017 edition

HomeLet Rental Index provides comprehensive and up to date data on new tenancies in the UK. Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, including the rental amounts agreed, the number of tenants moving into the property together with the employment status, income and age of all tenants. The trends reported within the HomeLet Rental Index are brand new tenancies which were arranged in the most recent period, giving the most relevant insight into changes in the Private Rented Sector.

# It's interesting to note...

• The average UK rental value was £888pcm - this is 0.7% higher than the same period last year (£882pcm) and a reduction in the rate of increase seen in January 2016 (3.9%)




## Monthly variance in average rent in the UK



## It's interesting to note...

• The UK average rental value has reduced by 0.4% since December 2016 - this is lower than the monthly variance in January 2016 (+0.5%) and January 2015 (+0.4%)

• This is the fifth month in a row where we have seen a reduction in monthly variance, and is notably dissimilar to the same period in previous years



- In January 2017 average rental values in London (£1,497) were 68.5% higher than the UK (£888)
- The gap between London and the rest of the UK was comparable to January 2016 (69%) and higher than January 2015 (66.3%)




